

ANTERIOR PREP GUIDE


VENEER PREPARATION

A medium grit, round-ended diamond bur is used to remove a uniform thickness of facial enamel by joining the depth-cut grooves.




INCISAL PREPARATION

The diamond bur is angled to bevel the incisal edge.



CHAMFER MARGINS


Correct preparations of the chamfer margins interproximally allow the appropriate bulk of porcelain.




- When closing a diastema, interproximal margins need to extend to lingual marginal ridges, eliminating any and all undercuts.
- When not closing a diastema, do not break tooth contacts. Stop tooth reduction prior to breaking natural contacts.
- Uniform facial preparation is recommended.


POSTERIOR CROWN PREPARATION
